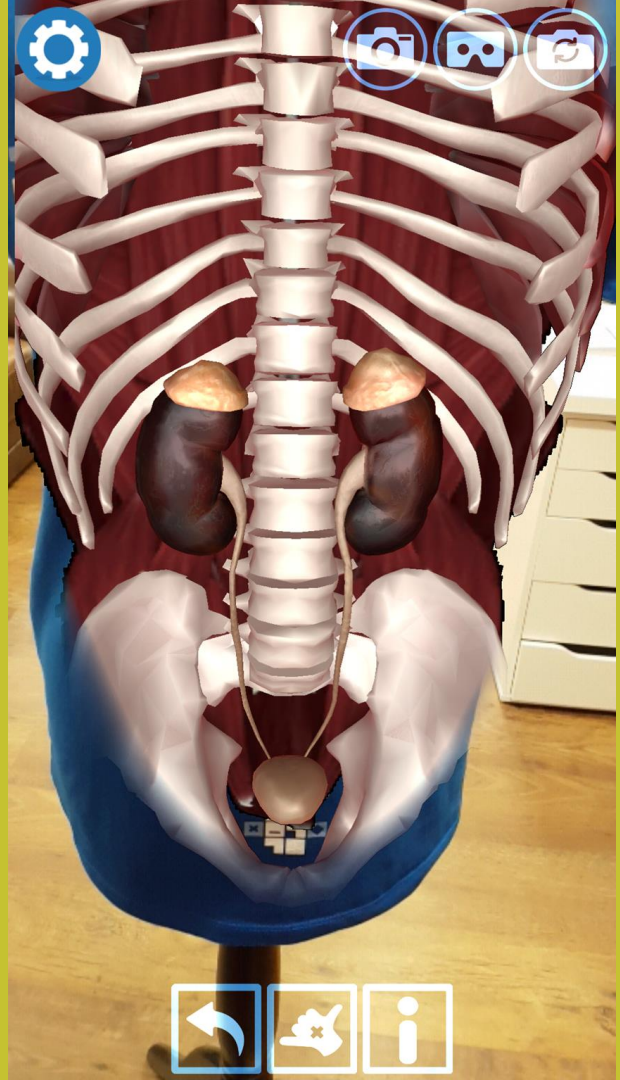
It is also known as the urinary system (“urina” in Latin means “pee”).

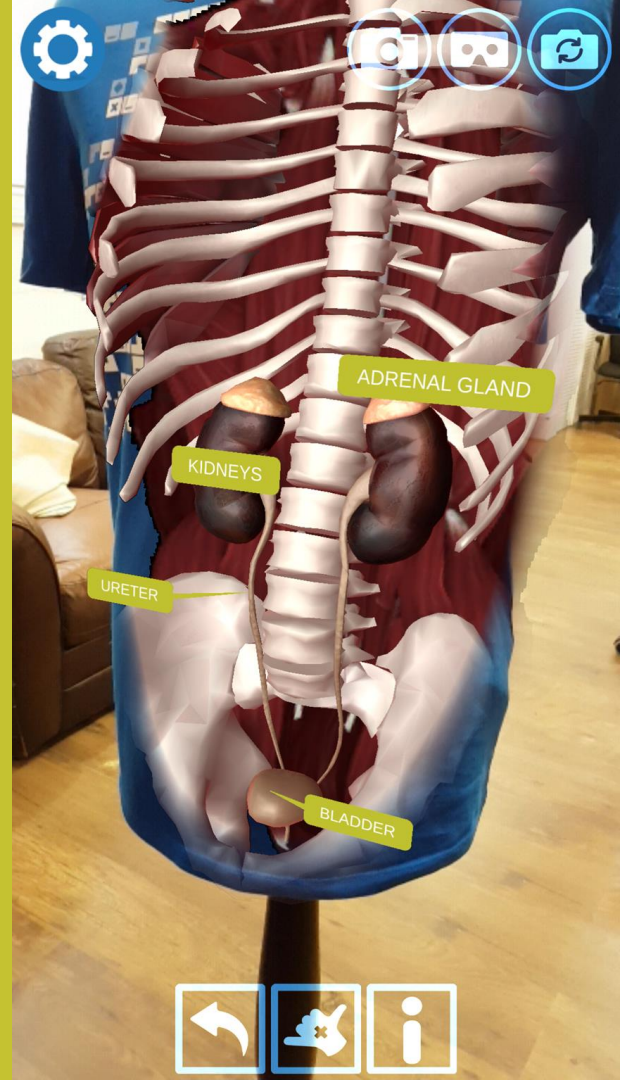
While it doesn't give you night vision, adrenaline does dilate your pupils letting in more light.

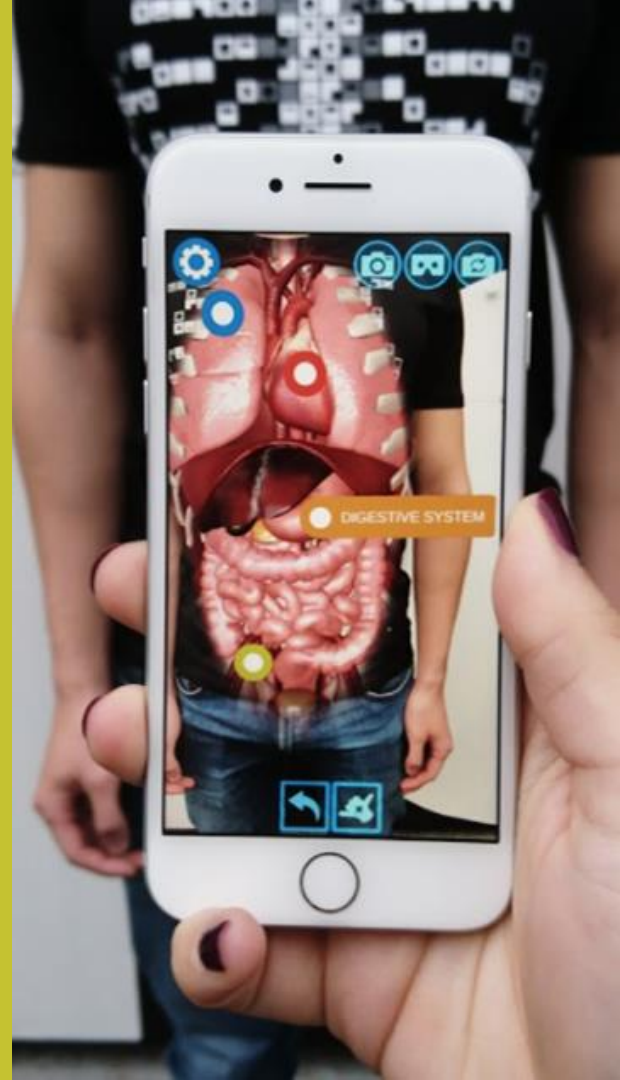
The kidneys are made up of millions of nephrons, which are like tiny filters for catching waste products from your body.
